In 1988, the GO Station opened in Burlington and the 1906 Burlington Junction or Freeman Station as it was commonly known, located at Plains Road and Brant St., closed and sat derelict for many years. Thanks to several local historians and train enthusiasts the original station was restored and now sits on Fairview St. just west of Brant St., beside the fire hall. The historic station is open to the public to enjoy on scheduled Saturdays or by appointment. Regrettably, we are currently closed due to COVID-19 but are planning to open as soon as regulations allow.
